Neil Crone is a Canadian actor, comedian, writer, and motivational speaker, who provided voices for some of the well-known characters in Thomas and the Magic Railroad and Thomas & Friends: All Engines Go!

Improvisation partners Neil Crone and Kevin Frank had originally auditioned to voice the Troublesome Trucks. Crone was given the role of Diesel 10 when Britt Allcroft and the producers heard him doing a Russian accent whilst fooling around during the recording of the trucks' lines. The Russian accent was eventually dropped after test audiences claimed that it would be offensive. While fooling around, Frank and Crone were asked to try out for some of the other characters.

Besides voicing many of the characters, Neil Crone and Kevin Frank were also asked to add more comedy to the script. It was Neil Crone's idea to name Diesel 10's claw "Pinchy". Both were "creative consultants" for the film.

Over twenty years after his voiceover work for Thomas and the Magic Railroad, Crone reprised his role as Gordon for the All Engines Go! reboot.

Other credits include, Ray on the Canadian sitcom "Really Me", Mr. Borba in "Good Witch", Fred Tupper in "Little Mosque on the Prarie", several characters in "Odd Squad", Agent Kringle in "Eloise at Christmastime" Several Mr. Men in the American dub of "Mr. Men and Little Miss" and Dwayne in "Total Drama Presents: The Ridonculous Race".

TIM WAS BORN AND RAISED IN STREETSVILLE, ONTARIO. HE IS A GRADUATE OF U

HE HAS BEEN MARRIED FOR 40 YEARS AND RETIRED FROM FORTY CREEK DISTILLERY AS VP SALES AND MARKETING AFTER 30 YEARS.

HE SPOKE TO OUR CLUB 3 YEARS AGO ABOUT HIS TESLA CAR. HE RETURNS TO GIVE US AN EXPANDED UPDATE ON ELECTRIC VEHICLES IN GENERAL.

TIM INTRODUCED HIS TOPIC TODAY AS COVERING ELECTRIC VEHICLES AND SELF DRIVING CARS.

WHY ELECTRIC? WAS HIS OPENING QUESTION?

FUN TO DRIVE,

MORE CONVENIENT TO CHARGE WITH INCREASED NUMBER OF STATIONS AND FASTER CHARGING.

EASY TO CHARGE

AN CHEAPNESS OF TECH UPDATES KEEP THEM ON THE ROAD FOR LONG TIME.

INEXPENSIVE POWER AND LOW ENVIRONMENTAL FOOTPRINT.

HE COMPARED THE THEORETICAL TIME TAKEN ON AN ANNUAL BASIS TO MANUALLY FILL A GAS-POWERED CAR AND CHARGING AN EV. HE CLAIMED 8 HOURS VS 1 HOUR FOR EV'S.

APPARENTLY STATSCAN REPORTS 1200 CHARGING STATIONS NOW IN ONTARIO WITHOUT COUNTING DOMESTIC LOCATIONS.

HE NOTED THE NUMBER OF AUTO MANUFACTURERS THAT HAS ANNOUNCED PLANS TO ABANDON INTERNAL COMBUSTION ENGINE MODELS FOR ALL ELECTRIC IS GROWING AND IS NOW ALMOST THE MAJORITY.

IN ADDITION TO ELECTRIC CARS, HE INTRODUCED THE TOPIC OF SELF DRIVE VEHICLES.

HE REMINDED US OF THE INNOVATIONS SUCH AS COLOR TV IPHONES, THE INTERNET IN OUR LIFETIME. THEY APPEARDE FANTASTIC BEFORE THEY BECAME A REALITY BUT NOW ARE PART OF DAILY LIFE. EMBRACING THIS TECHNOLOGY IS EQUIVALENT TO FIGURATIVELY LETTING GO OF THE WHEEL.

SELF DRIVE VEHICLES ARE NOT YET FULLY PERFECTED NOR IS THE ROAD ENVIRONMENT TOTALL CONDUCIVE TO THEM. HOWEVER, TIM PREDICTS THAT WITHIN 15 YEARS, A CHILD BORN IN 2018 WILL NEVER NEED TO TAKE A DRIVING TEST. IT WON'T BE NECESSARYHE THEN OUTLINED THE LEVELS OF DRIVING AUTONOMY.

HUMAN DRIVING

SELF DRIVE WITH THE CAPACITY FOR THE HUMAN DRIVER TO TAKE OVER.

SELF DRIVE, DRIVE SAFELY WITH HUMAN ONLY NEEDING CORRECTION INFREQUENTLY.

SELF DRIVE ALL THE TIME. HUMAN COULD GO TO SLEEP.

SELF DRIVE ALL THE TIME IN ALL CONDITIONS.

BENEFITS OF SELF DRIVING VEHICLES ARE FEWER FATALITIES. AS 94% OF FATALITIES ARE CAUSED BY HUMAN ERROR.

COST OF EV ARE COMING DOWN AND WILL ACHIEVE PARITY WITH INTERNAL COMBUSTION ENGINE CARS.

THE LACK OF DRIVER COSTS WILL REDUCE SHIPPING COSTS DRAMATICALLY.

CAR OWNERSHIP WILL DECLINE AS EV AVAILABILITY FOR TAXIS WILL MAKE OWNERSHIP REDUNDANT.

CURRENTLY THE AVERAGE CAR IS ONLY USED 4% OF THE TIME. THE ARRIVAL OF SELF DRIVE VEHICLES WILL LEAD TO MORE EFFICEIENT VEHICLE USAGE, LESS CONGESTION AND DECLINING NEEDS FOR ROAD SPACE. CURRENTLY THERE ARE 1

MILLION CARS IN TORONTO WHICH COULD BE REPLACED BY 50,000 EV'S TO COVER THE SAME MILEAGE.

AN INTERESTING ASIDE WAS THE SUGGESTION THAT THE GROWTH IN HEALTH MONITORING TECHNOLOGY BY HUMANS THROUGH THE PHONE CONNECTION COULD LEAD TO A SELF DRIVE VEHICLE REALIZING A PASSENGER WAS HAVING A HEALTH EVENT AND AUTOMATICALLY TAKE THEM TO HOSPITAL. PRESUMABLY THEIR HEALTH INFO, VITAL SIGNS ETC COULD BE COMMUNICATED TO EMERGENCY AHEAD OF TIME!!!!!!

THIS TECH INNOVATION WILL BE MASSIVELY DISRUPTIVE TO SOCIETY AND ITS PHYSICAL ORGANIZATION BUT IT WILL HAPPEN. 150 YEARS AGO 80% OF THE POPULATION WERE INVOLVED IN AGRICULTURE. NOW THERE ARE LESS THAN 3% INVOLVED IN AGRICULTURE AND WE GROW MORE FOOD. SOCIETY SURVIVES DISRUPTION AND MOVES ON.

THE CHALLENGE FACING SELF DRIVING TECHNOLOGGY IS SOCIETAL ACCEPTANCE.

HOWEVER, HE EXPECTS IT WILL COME AND WITH CANADA'S MINERAL WEALTH AND AUTOMOBILE MANUFACTURING INFRASTRUCTURE THERE IS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR CANADA TO BE A MAJOR PLAYER IN THE COMING TRANSPORTATION REVOLUTION.

TIM ACCEPTED NUMEROUS QUESTIONS AND THE Q&A WENT ON FOR SOME 20 MINUTES COVERING SUCH TOPICS AS:

SPEED OF EV CHARGING

RELATIVE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT DUE TO ELECTRICITY COST IN MANUFACTURING AND OPERATION OF EVS

EV PERFORMANCE IN COLD CLIMATES

COST OF IN GARAGE CHARGERS.

PROBLEMS WITH PERMISSION TO INSTALL CHARGERS IN OWNED PARKING SPACES IN CONDO GARAGES.

USED CAR VALUE OF EV'S?

HYDROGEN POWER 'S IMPRACTICALITY AS A REPLACEMENT FOR ELECTRICITY AND BATTERY TECHNOLOGY.

ROY OLDFIELD THANKED THE SPEAKER AND REFLECTED THE WIDESPREAD APPRECIATION OF THE AUDIENCE. TIM THANKED THE AUDIENCE AND OFFERED TO RETURN TO SPEAK ABOUT HIS CAREER AND KNOWLEDGE IN MAKING WHISKY.

In 2022 we celebrate the 20th anniversary of our club.

We are very sociable group of a dozen members who are focused on financial planning. We meet monthly to compare strategies and knowledge which can guide our own planning. Each month we review a virtual portfolio of Canadian stocks. This was valued at \$200,000 in 2002, and is now grown to \$1,069,380.

Although we don't presume to be able outsmart the market. Last year our portfolio increased 28.3% in market value compared to 21.7% for the TSX. We share responsibility for maintaining the portfolio and we are open to discussing alternative investments.

Members share their own experiences, strategies and knowledge of investments including tax strategy and alternatives such as gold, cash, bitcoins, and real estate, and we consider how to manage risks, such as new technologies, international events, pandemics, and politics.

Meetings normally take place on the third Thursday of each month at 10am in the Bronte area and currently we Zoom at 4pm.

We are open to having an additional member who wishes to learn and contribute.
