Captain Oleg Dolzikov

Master Mariner (Retired), Teek

This month, we are delighted to welcome **Captain Oleg Dolzikov**, a recently retired **Master Mariner with 'TK' Shipping**. Founded by **Torben Karlshoej** in 1973, **Teekay** has developed from a regional *shipping* company over the last **fifty years** into one of the world's largest **marine energy transportation**, **storage & production companies**.

Oleg Dolzikov grew up in the small industrial city of Sterlitamak in the Russian Ural Mountains on the outskirts of Siberia, thousands of kilometres from the sea. When he was 17, he left his Russian home for the Ukrainian port of Odessa to fulfil his dream – to become a ship's captain. After many years with the Latvian Shipping Company and other Norwegian oil and gas shipping companies, Oleg settled in Canada where, for 3 years, starting in 2002, he was transporting Terra Nova and Hibernia crude oils from Nfld to Cdn and US terminals as Master on the largest Canadian oil tanker with the 'TK' oil fleet. This is probably the only time 'TK' has employed a shipmaster directly from outside the company (source: 'Teekay' – the first 40 years; Brian Ingpen, p.174 ¹).

Oleg then transferred to **Teekay's LNG Division** (Liquified Natural Gas) in 2005 and was ship's Master on various LNG ships for the next 18 years transporting mainly **Qatari and Indonesian** LNG to Europe and the Far East (South Korea, Japan, China). At various times, he was Master of the first Teekay-built LNG tanker '**Al Marrouna**' (2006), and the '**Tangguh Hiri**' (a Sundanese-Indonesian name meaning 'tough').

'Seapeak' is the rebranded evolution of Teekay LNG Partners. Oleg retired in February, 2024 from Teekay; he recently consulted for a private Québec company which provides various marine services to shipping companies, including ice piloting & advisory services. His chat with us today is coincidental to a recent shipping

tragedy in Baltimore, Md., involving a different type of vessel, however.

Oleg will share his global seafaring adventures and comment upon how Canada depends upon LNG which is an important part of Canada's energy resources. More than six million Canadians use natural gas to light, heat and cool homes and businesses, to heat water, and for cooking (source: Canadian Energy Centre ²). Today about one third of Canada's entire energy needs are met by natural gas.

PROFILER

Ermanno Pascutto told us how he and his mother and sister came to Canada by boat in 1958. Leaving from Genoa Italy and landing in Halifax at the famous Pier 21.

Fast forward to student days at U of T, Ermanno made the switch from Commerce and Finance to Law and after graduation joined the firm of Osler, Hoskins and Harcourt. While still with the firm he was loaned out to the Toronto Securities Commission and over time and management changes at the top, Ermanno became the legal advisor at the Securities Exchange and then Executive Director.

After a period of time and after dealing with a number of high-profile hostile takeovers of Toronto listed companies, Ermanno was recruited to run the Hong Kong exchange.

SPEAKER

Don Jack introduced our speaker-----Jason Stitt

Jason is co-founder of IT Force, a Burlington based company that gives computer support to an array of companies plus families and individuals. The range of companies include manufacturing, wholesale, real estate and finance and can be based anywhere, not just Ontario.

Jason's presentation was about cybersecurity which is protecting anyone, companies, governments and individuals, from hackers and anyone trying to exploit a weakness in the system. Lack of cybersecurity leads to cybercrime which is anything from intercepting funds to locking up a computer system until a ransom is paid.

Cyber-attacks can originate from China, Russian, North Korea or India for example which have state sponsored hackers or it could be individual groups that have a cause and just need money to further their cause. The hackers are looking for anyway to get into your bank account, email account, CRA account, Amazon or PayPal accounts. If any of these are breached, it makes all of them vulnerable.

Everyone at the meeting got a handout with IT Force tips for both personal and business security tips.

For individuals here are some key tips we remind ourselves about:

Use Anti-Virus software

Use Complex passwords and keep them updated
Use VPN software on your computers and mobile devices
Use Multi-Factor Authentication for all accounts
Turn on real time transaction notifications for your credit cards
Do regular systems updates and back up your data
