Dr. Myriam Nafte <u>`Trophies & Talismans'.</u>

This month, we are delighted to welcome once again **Dr. Myriam Nafte** – a renowned authority and professional in the field of **Forensics and Crime Scene Investigation**. For **over twenty-five years, Myriam has worked with law enforcement to investigate and identify human remains in a forensic context while honing her skills as an artist**. Today's presentation showcases a very different, controversial and provoking angle, however.

Authorities are often at odds with how to proceed when discovering human remains in **private collections or displayed as art** - not necessarily in an accredited museum. Against the backdrop of **plundered graves and private auctions across the world**, today's conversation is a journey into how and why the undisposed dead have become such **symbolic features of contemporary culture**.

As a **visual artist and skeletal biologist** with a long history of drawing and analyzing the human body, both living and dead, Myriam will talk about her experiences as a forensic anthropologist/visual artist, very often at the crossroads between death and the art world. To animate her work, Myriam also has some **exhibits to share with us**. We may see & hear unexpected connections between the living and the dead!

Ivor Barlow introduced our speaker-----Captain Oleg Dolzikov, Master Mariner

Captain Oleg Dolzikov, a recently retired Master Mariner with 'TK' Shipping. Founded in 1973, Teekay has developed from a regional shipping company over the last fifty years into one of the world's largest marine energy transportation, storage production companies.

Oleg Dolzikov grew up in the small industrial city of Sterlitamak in the Russian Ural Mountains on the outskirts of Siberia, thousands of kilometres from the sea. When he was just 17, he left his Russian home for the Ukrainian port of Odessa to fulfil his dream – to become a ship's captain.

After many years with the Latvian Shipping Company and other Norwegian oil and gas shipping companies, in 2002, Oleg settled in Canada and joined the TeeKay Company.

Oleg was Master on some of the largest oil and LNG tankers in the world before retiring in 2024. In the last few months, he has consulted for a private Quebec company.
