Dr. Melanie Cousins, Epidemiologist, Risk Management - Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC)

This month, we are delighted to welcome **Dr. Melanie** ('Mel') Cousins, a Federal Epidemiologist with the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC).

Today's conversation will focus on the work of the **PHAC**, an essential part of our Federal Health Department. Its major activities focus on preventing disease and injuries, responding to public health threats, promoting good physical and mental health, and providing information to support informed decision making.

Until **Covid-19** presented itself in Canada in 2020, many of us had little idea of the important work that epidemiologists conduct to keep us safe and informed.



Previously, we may have been aware generally of radio/TV/newspaper segments alluding to e.g. **SARS**, **chickenpox**, **tuberculosis**, **influenza or measles** outbreaks. Throughout those challenging times and up to the present in which **59,713** residents died of Covid-related factors ¹, **Melanie & her colleagues** across Canada and beyond, largely behind the scenes, have worked to identify the nature of these changing threats and others which affect us more as climate change and other circumstances evolve.

Melanie will trace the origins of modern-day epidemiology and its various components, showing the path that is followed from the discovery of new **pathogenic variants**, through investigation, assessment and communication. We

may well be surprised by the breadth and incidence of viruses and bacteria that are present daily.

Wolfgang Hartmann introduced our speaker----Cait Bowie, Field Educator, Alzheimer Society of Canada.

Cait Bowie gave an extremely interesting lecture on some of the problems facing people as they age and what to watch for in our own behavior that could signal the beginning stages of dementia.

Some changes in our memory and the way we handle ourselves is normal. Arthritis is normal. Lapses in memory is normal. Dementia is not normal.

The are somewhere between 120 and 200 types of Dementia

- Alzheimer's is one type of dementia and it can come early or late in a person's life
- Vascular dementia is caused by a stroke or a series of TIAs.
- Lewy Body is a type of Parkinson's Disease and causes problems with movement
- Frontotemporal Dementia is rare and causes changes to behavior and personality.
- Mixed Dementia is a combination of Alzheimer's and Vascular.

Risk of getting Dementia can be reduced by:

- Staying connected to friends, family and social groups
- Having a healthy diet
- Reduce risks of falls by using a cane, walker, grab bars etc.
- Stay active which reduces BP, lowers cholesterol, gets heart pumping
- Keep brain active with puzzles etc.
- Limit smoking and drinking
- Use hearing aids if necessary
- Monitor your health with regular doctor and dentist visits.
