# **Rob Pyle & The Avro Arrow**



Rob has extensive experience in Design and Management Services in the fields of process control, instrumentation, control systems and automation

This month, we are delighted to welcome **Rob Pyle**, a Volunteer Director with the Avro Aviation Museum in **Springbank**, just West of **Calgary**. **Rob** was formerly the President of **R. H. Pyle & Associates**, where he offered design and management services in process control, instrumentation, control systems and automation to engineering and operating companies in Canada and abroad. His wealth of knowledge has been a key resource in reconstructing a **60% operational model of the former Arrow CF105**, the supersonic interceptor jet aircraft designed and built in the 1950s by A.V. Roe Canada (**AVRO**) and destroyed on Government orders in 1959 with the **loss of 25,000 direct and indirect jobs**.

When the **Arrow** program was shut down, some of Avro's aviation 'off-spring' survived, albeit with different names. **SPAR Aerospace** was formed in 1967 and its achievements (including the Shuttle and Space Station's '**Canadarms'**) were recognized worldwide.

Today, Rob will talk to us about his colleagues' work at **Springbank**, including:

- A.V. Roe's overall contribution to Canada as a creative and visionary pioneering force in aircraft/transportation engineering.
- The story of the **C102 Jetliner**¹ and how it **almost** became the world's first jet-powered airliner well ahead of its nearest

competitor.

- The design and building of the original Arrow CF 105, its cancellation, and the continuing controversies around the Diefenbaker decision.
- His team's project to bring a 60% operational CF 105 model back to the skies in 2026/27.



- 1. Access the e-transfer area of your bank's online banking screen.
- 2. Set up the Oakville Probus Club as an e-transfer recipient. Use oakvilleprobusno5@gmail.com as the club's email address.

You will only need to set up the Club for the first e-transfer. After that the Oakville Probus Club will be included in your personal e-transfer directory.

- 3. Identify the account from which you want to send the transfer and amount of the payment that you wish to send.
- 4. In the message area specify the purpose of the e-transfer payment (Usually your name, name of guest(s) and entrée choice)

Do not create a security question/password. This will prevent the auto deposit from happening.

- 5. Click on "Send". You will receive an immediate response that your payment has been sent and deposited into the Club bank account.
- 6. All e-transfers are automatically encrypted and are highly secure. No personal or bank data that is attached to the e-transfer can be hacked or stolen by a third party.

# Minutes of the General Meeting of the Probus Club of Oakville Sept. 19, 2024 Oakville Public Library

#### **GENERAL MEETING**

Paul Nelson then called the General Meeting to order.

#### **SPEAKER**

Helmut Erxleben introduced today's speaker **Drew Fagan** who is joining us today via Zoom,

This month, we welcome Drew Fagan a professor and writer at the MunkSchool of Global Affairs and Public Policy, University of Toronto; Drew is also a senior advisor at McMillan Vantage Policy Group.

Drew previously spent 12 years in leadership positions with the Province of Ontario and the Government of Canada where he was Assistant DeputyMinister for strategic policy and planning at the Department of ForeignAffairs and International Trade (now Global Affairs Canada). He was also a former Washington correspondent for The Globe and Mail.

As Drew and his colleagues argue in a recent essay<sup>1</sup>, the deep economic integration of Canada and the United States may be long-established, but shared vision and shared purpose are not as explicit as they once were. Canada is being drawn more deeply into the U.S. orbit just when that orbit is less stable, geopolitical tension is becoming alarming, and our productivity and real wage growth is decreasing.

Today, Drew will share three essential strategies that Canada must embrace with great urgency i.e.: "deepen; broaden; and accelerate" the economy. "For all the handwringing over Canada being more alone in the world than ever, our good geography and better geology mean we are not without cards to play

**Drew Fagan - Executive Summary** 

A school of thought has arisen that Canada has never been more alone in the world. We respectfully disagree.

The world abounds with new challenges, to be sure, but also new opportunities that play to Canada's strengths. To make the most of these opportunities, we need to align our national interests with those of our closest partners, especially the United States, and turn key advantages into strategic assets. As things stand, we see a Canada that is too often transactional and reactive.

The strategy to "Matter More" that is presented in this paper aims to reinforce Canada's role both on the continent and in the global arena through a handful of high-impact sectoral initiatives that focus on economics and security — what we call Auto Pact 2.0s. These will enable Canada to better protect and project our national interests alongside our partners in a more divided and dangerous world and a more polarized United States.

The four key areas for policy action are:

#### **Arctic security**

Enhancing collaboration on Arctic defense by leveraging Canada's strategic geographical position and advanced surveillance technologies;

**Critical minerals** 

Strengthening continental efforts in the production and processing of minerals that are central to energy and military applications, allowing Canada and the United States to reduce reliance on less-trusted countries, particularly China, and support our allies.

**Energy and environment** 

Promoting joint independence and security through increased continental co-operation on the environment and energy, and sharing North America's extra- ordinary energy strengths with our partners; and

Technology

Investing in advanced digital and life sciences technologies such as artificial intelligence and quantum computing with an emphasis on our value- adds in global supply chains.

A focus on these four areas will deepen co-ordination with the United States and broaden cooperation with other select global partners. But it will not happen if Canada does not also accelerate our building and procurement in the real time of geopolitical competition.

Grant Swanson thanked the speaker and Paul Nelson declared the meeting closed.
