After that the Oakville Probus Club will be included in your personal e-transfer directory.

3. Identify the account from which you want to send the

transfer and amount of the payment that you wish to send.
4. In the message area specify the purpose of the e-transfer payment (Usually your name, name of guest(s) and entrée choice)

Do not create a security question/password. This will prevent the auto deposit from happening.

- 5. Click on "Send". You will receive an immediate response that your payment has been deposited into the Club bank account.
- 6. All e-transfers are automatically encrypted and are highly secure. No personal or bank data that is attached to the e-transfer can be hacked or stolen by a third party.

Minutes of the General Meeting of the Probus Club of Oakville October 17th, 2024 Meeting held via Zoom

Paul Nelson opened the meeting at 10:00 a.m. with an update on the flooding situation at the Central Library and why today's meeting had to be held remotely.

1.0 Minutes

Paul Nelson suggested that the approval of the September General Meeting be done at the next meeting. The minutes themselves consisted of only the speaker's information as no club business was discussed after the annual meeting closed.

2.0 Membership and Guests

Jay introduced two new members, Cam Davreux and Rory Mahon.

Jay reminded all members that if any annual fees of \$75 are still outstanding they can still be paid via e-transfer or a cheque sent to Jay's home address.

SPEAKER

Wolfgang Hartmann introduced our speaker---- Rob Pyle

This month, we are delighted to welcome Rob Pyle, a Volunteer Director with the Avro Aviation Museum in Springbank, just west of Calgary. Rob was formerly the President of R. H. Pyle & Associates, where he offered design and management services in process control, instrumentation, control systems and automation to engineering and operating companies in Canada and abroad. His wealth of knowledge has been a key resource in reconstructing a 60% operational model of the former Arrow CF105, the supersonic interceptor jet aircraft designed and built in the 1950s by A.V. Roe Canada (AVRO) and destroyed on Government orders in 1959 with the loss of 25,000 direct and indirect jobs.

When the Arrow program was shut down, some of Avro's aviation 'off-spring' survived, albeit with different names. SPAR Aerospace was formed in 1967 and its achievements (including the Shuttle and Space Station's 'Canadarms') were recognized worldwide.

Rob did a power point presentation showing great photos of the huge facilities at Malton and the planes at various stages of production on the line. It is easy to see how 20,000 men and women could be working in that one plant.

AV Roe produced the CF 102 which was the first jet liner and received great response from American buyers included Howard Hughes who immediately ordered 20 with a letter of intent for another 50. This jet liner was 8 years ahead of the competition.

The AVRO Arrow, model CF105, was developed and made its first flight on the same day that the Russian Sputnik was sent up so the story was knocked off page one.

Again, the plane out performed any of the competition and broke all records and even broke the sound barrier on its third flight.

AVRO was owned 75% by the government and 25% by Hawker Sidley so when C.D. Howe and John Diefenbaker said to stop production and shut down there was no recourse. February 20th, 1959 was known as BLACK FRIDAY. The government just did not want to spend more money regardless of the revenue potential down the road and ignored the loss of 25,000 plus jobs.

There is lots of detail available on line and you just have to start goggling AVRO Arrow and go from there.

Rob and his colleagues are building a 60% operational model CF 105 and hope to have it in the skies in 2026/27. The dream is to do a fly over at the Calgary stampede.
