# The Voyage of the Vikings

We are delighted that Lynn Holden will be our speaker on January 16.



Lynn Holden was raised on a farm in Clarkson, Ontario now part of Mississauga. It was there that Lynn's love of nature, open spaces and the adventure of exploration began.

In 1991 Lynn happened to be in L'Anse aux Meadows, Newfoundland when the Viking ship the "Gaia" arrived from Norway in celebration of the Norse Vikings discovering and settling in Newfoundland a thousand years before. As the ship neared the pier a fog encased it. As this mysterious form approached the shore Lynn's imagination was tweaked. "Perhaps she should follow in the ship's wake so that she could document their journey with her photographs."

At that time Lynn was an educator and professional photographer. For the next thirty years Lynn searched for the clues that the Vikings had left behind. She travelled to Norway where she followed the Vikings to England, Scotland, Ireland, the Faroe Islands, Iceland, Greenland and back to North America. Then she travelled to Denmark and followed the Vikings to England, France, Sicily and Malta. Her last trip was to Sweden, the Baltic States, Russia, Ukraine and Turkey.

Upon completing her voyage she sat down and wrote about these amazing people. Her book "The Voyage of the Vikings" is illustrated with her beautiful photographs. Lynn now resides in Horseshoe Valley, Ontario and at her summer cabin in Magnetewan with her husband Norm and their Egyptian rescue dog, Shay.

Lynn will be present in person. Lynn will bring books for sale, which she will sign.

### 1.0 Minutes

#### 4. President's Report

Paul welcomed today's profiler, Dr. Ernest Ewaschuk M.D

Dr. Ewaschuk described to us, in humble, modest and understated terms, the fascinating arc of his career in Medicine from the Universities of Windsor, Western, Yale and eventually back to Hamilton and Oakville. Ernest specialized at various times in Oncology, Obstetrics & Gynecology and IVF bringing hope and life to countless families who knew the joy of conceiving children naturally and those who yearned for IVF treatments. (One member of our Club shared his thanks to Ernest for the professional guidance and assistance which Ernest had been shown to his family on their personal journey to conceive.)

As a notable feature of his personal character and philosophy, he shared with us how he worked during his early years of study and junior residencies in various locations with the underprivileged, handicapped and Indigenous communities in Canada and the USA.

Ernest retired several years ago and can share his love of cottaging, hunting, fishing, sailing and other interests with his family.

#### 6.0 SPEAKER

Following a short break, Mike Purcell introduced today's speaker (and Club Member) **Peter Pook**.

Peter proceeded to take us through his career in toys, both as a senior executive and creator/designer/marketer in a lighthearted and fun way, sharing the remarkable successes of his personal creations - and occasional failures.

In addition to his personal exploits, Peter shared the history of toys through the ages and two things were evident:

- Aside from 21 Century technology, there are few new things in toys. The Egyptians and other civilizations of yesteryear were designing toys thousands of years ago (~3,500 BC);
- Just when you think a toy is old, suddenly it isn't quite so any longer, with new creative wrinkles being bolted on to an existing idea regularly.
